## ACADEMIC TRANSCRIPT - EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. **ACCREDITATION:** Mount Allison University is a member of:  
The Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada  
The Association of Commonwealth Universities.
2. **ACADEMIC SESSIONS:** The regular academic year includes Fall and Winter terms, each with approximately 13 weeks of classes and an examination period. A few courses are offered during six week Intersession and Summer Session periods. Some correspondence courses are offered throughout the year.
3. **ACADEMIC STATUS:** Students are in Good Standing unless otherwise indicated on the transcript.
4. **COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM:** The first digit indicates the year in which the course is normally taken, the middle two specify a particular course within a department and the fourth indicates the course weight. A two term full credit course is numbered ending in 0; first and second term half credit courses end in 1 and 2 respectively; a two term half credit course ends in 3. In the Department of Fine Arts only, courses ending in 15, 20 and 25 have credit weights of 1.5, 2.0 and 2.5 respectively.
5. **GRADING SYSTEM:** With the exception of supplementals and a few pass/fail courses, results are reported on a numerical percentage basis. The pass mark for each course is 50%. A mark of 75% or more satisfies scholarship standing. Successful results are classified as:  
**80-100% *Excellent*;** 1st class standing; distinction, scholarship level; performs better than most students.  
**70-79% *Very Good*;** 2nd class standing; performs above the average level of other students. Scholarship standing is 75% and above.  
**60-69% *Satisfactory*;** 3rd class standing; performs at the average level of other students.  
**50-59% *Marginal*;** pass; performs below the average of other students.  
**0-49% *Failure*.**
6. **PROGRAMME REQUIREMENTS:** All undergraduate degrees require completion of the equivalent of 20 full courses. There is also a one year post-Baccalaureate B.Ed. programme and a two year undergraduate Engineering Certificate programme. A full course offered from September to April carries a 1.0 credit weight; half courses offered in either the September to December or January to April terms or as full year half offerings carry a 0.5 credit weight. Course credit weights are indicated on the transcript.
7. **SYMBOLS USED:**  
**AEG.** - Aegrotat. Credit standing very occasionally awarded when serious illness has prevented normal completion of the course.  
**AUD.** - Audit. No Credit awarded.  
**CR.** - Credit.  
**DEF.** - Course results deferred.
